

Jesus Youth Jubilee

An aura of festivity and immense joy hung over the entire Rajagiri Campus, Kakkanad, Cochin, on the day the J.Y. Jubilee Conference dawned. The JY is an international Catholic youth movement, an initiative of young people themselves, who, filled with the Holy Spirit try to reach out to other young people with a charismatic spirituality. It had its small beginnings in Kerala, and is now active in 29 countries. The strength of the movement is its special focus on a life centred on Jesus, nourished by Prayer, the Word of God, the Sacraments and fellowship and sharing the Good News of Jesus with others. It was officially recognized by the catholic Bishops' Conference of India.

Five of us Cjs, Srs. Feby, Jaya, Sherly, Nelcy and Sheetal were lucky to be part of this great gathering of the Catholic Church. It was a moment of joy and pride for all present, as delegates from 29 countries carried their flags and jubilee crosses in a colorful inaugural procession. The Ecclesiastical Advisor of JY India, Archbishop Abraham Viruthukulangara of Nagpur read out the greetings and message from the Holy Father exhorting the movement to create greater awareness among young people of the missionary dimension of being a Christian.





His Eminence Cardinal Ivan Dias inaugurated the Conference by lighting the main lamp followed by the rest of the dignitaries. A solemn

High Mass with Cardinal as the main celebrant followed thereafter. At the beginning of the Mass Archbishop Abraham read out the decree of indulgence. During the homily the Cardinal said that the jubilee celebration coincides with the feast of the Holy Innocents, the silent witnesses of Jesus Christ. He invited the youth to be renewed in their vocation, in their call to be witness to Jesus with their sweat, with their word and if God wills, with their blood. In the presence of 6 Archbishops, 20 Bishops, 800 priests, 1500 sisters and around 20,000 other participants, special blessings were conferred upon the congregation by His Eminence Cardinal Ivan Dias at the close of a meaningful and grace-filled Mass.

The programmes were well organized in 7 streams such as:- kids, pre-teens, teens, youth, married couples, priests and religious sisters. Each stream had input sessions based on the jubilee theme Refined in Thy fire, Renewed by Thy Spirit and Radiant in Thy Holiness, by efficient speakers. Short prayer services, action songs and life witnesses of JY full timers in between the sessions kept us alive and alert. Bishop Henry

D'Souza in his session for the sisters emphasized that the world needs religious who can motivate, energize and draw out the best in others. After 4.30 pm all the streams gathered together for evening payer, adoration, the mesmerizing music by the Rex Band and for cultural programs. Fr. Fio Mascarenhas SJ pointed out that the world, which is marked by corruption, abortion, anxiety

and all other vices, needs a new reformation and JY is rightly poised for that mission. The conclusion of the programme coincided with the New Year 2011. We welcomed the New Year by singing the praises of the Almighty during a night vigil and the high point was the Solemn Eucharistic Celebration. It was a moment of happiness, joy and gratitude. Everyone present there experienced the outpouring of the Spirit.



For us, it was a time of renewal and evaluation of our own religious commitment. Listening to the life experiences and tireless efforts of JY, reaching out to 29 countries to proclaim Jesus' love and His values, we were challenged to examine our own commitment to the youth though we profess ".... especially to the care of youth". Our intensive journey of international tertianship began on the 1 July 2010. We entered into this great journey with an introductory talk by Sr. Sumita, the provincial superior of the Allahabad province. We were happy to be in the company of our companions under the guidance of Sr. Deepa, our tertian director. Staying and sharing together in the spirit of the CJ helped us to imbibe more and more of the CJ family spirit. We were enriched by the sharing of experiences of one another and thus we prepared ourselves in the school of the heart to be placed with Christ totally, not partially.

Various topics like Constitutions, studies on the lives and spirituality of St. Ignatius and Mother Mary Ward, the fourth vow, dynamics of the Spiritual Exercises and other extra activities like cooking and other house hold activities strengthened us spiritually and mentally to be fitting instruments in our mission at the service of the Lord who has called us.

The dynamics of the spiritual exercises helped us to enter into the 30 days' spiritual journey with the Lord to experience His closeness.
